INTRODUCTION

The Wandering Whistling Duck Dendrocygna arcuata occurs across the Indonesian archiepelago, extending southwards into northern Australia and northwards to Mindanao, the Philippines (MacKinnon & Phillipps, 1993; Madge & Burns, 1988). The species is expected to be a breeding resident and partial migrant in southern Borneo (Kalimantan, Indonesia), with numerous records from the Barito and Mahakam drainages, although nesting has never been confirmed. Its preferred habitat in southern Borneo is freshwater wetlands and ox-bow lakes. Its northern limit to date (on Borneo) has been a flock of up to a 100 at Pontianak, western Kalimantan (Holmes, 1997). The species has not been recorded in the Malaysian part of Borneo (Smythies, 1999).

DESCRIPTION OF SIGHTING

In October 2003, Wandering Whistling Ducks were observed in an industrial area northeast of Kuching, Sarawak (N01° 35.736'; E110° 25.541'). Repeated sightings were obtained between 26th October and 12th November 2003. They were observed daily at one small pool with open water. A maximum eleven (11) birds used this pool. On 4th November, a single Lesser Whistling Duck *Dendrocygna javanica* was present, giving an opportunity to compare the two species. A comparison between these two species, which overlap in range, is given in Appendix I. On 11th November, an adult female Garganey *Anas querquedula* was also present. The birds were more active in the afternoons and late evenings.
