In the 2nd edition of *The Birds* of Borneo (Smythies, 1968), the Brown Quaker Babbler Alcippe brunneicauda was removed from the endemics list.

The 3rd edition of *The Birds of Borneo* (Smythies, 1981) added the following three birds to the list, bringing the total to 31 endemic birds.

- 1. Mountain Serpent Eagle Spilornis kinabaluensis
- 2. White-fronted Falconet Microhierax latifrons
- 3. Chestnut-crested Yuhina Yuhina everetti

The 4th and latest edition (Smythies, 1999) added eight more birds to the list, bringing the total to 39 endemics.
